# TRUSTEE REPORT

Questions about the roof answered by Timmy the Trustee.

- Why is the roof leaking?
- The roof was expensive why isn't the company responsible?
- What is being done to fix it?

The roof is leaking from the snow melting and refreezing into ice. This causes ice dams which hold the water back from flowing off the roof. The water backs up and finds entrance points above the installed panels that then trickles down and into the church. Water will always find a way to flow downhill. There are several flat areas that hold water on the structure of the roof.

The company assured us the roof wouldn't leak and when it rains it doesn't. The only time it leaks is when we have ice dams.

The church has several challenging structural problems that must be addressed. We have hired our snow removal company to shovel off the roof. (This winter it has been difficult to stay ahead of that snow build-up.) In the spring we may need to install more insulation between the ceiling and the roof. There is a need for ventilation to keep heat from building up in the attic space which melts the snow and create ice dams. Heat tapes are proposed for those areas in which ice dams form. This is a multifaceted challenge. It has been frustrating for everyone. The trustees are working to fix it. Thank you for your patience.
