You have this faith and love because of the hope reserved for you in heaven. You previously heard about this hope through the true message, the good news,



I was raised by a worrier. My Mother worried excessively about everything. We used to tease her and call her OSHA-Mel when she tried to impose her worries on our lives. Because of that I have tried to not be a worrier, to boldly take risks in my life. But, I have to say, this Covid crisis is making me worry. I worry about myself getting sick, I worry about my husband. I am very worried about my pregnant daughter -in-law. Mostly I am worried about the church and everyone of you. As I make plans to reopen on a limited basis, I worry who might feel left out. I worry what to do if more people show up than the allowed capacity. I worry that we might be the center of an outbreak. I read about a church in Calgary that allowed a celebration for a church member and 41 people got sick and two died. There is no way to go back from that. So, I will be operating out of an excess of caution. (My Mother would be proud.) I will not open until I feel it is safe to do so. In conjunction with the Bishop and a discussion and a vote by our AD-council the decision is to remain closed through June. When we do return, I will require the use of masks and social distancing. Should the numbers go dramatically down we will re-evaluate and ad-council will meet again the last week in June. I know how difficult it is to not worship together and I too mourn on Sunday morning. Still I think an abundance of caution is the right choice.

We have been blessed to have the skills of Darwin Alar to tape and edit our services. He produces a quality product and many are watching us on television and through our website. We are also blessed by the lively music provided by Shannon Gunderson. We are planning to live stream through Facebook but at this time it is impossible to get the equipment needed. So, for the time being we will continue to have videotaped services.

I thank you for your prayers, for your continued stewardship, for the notes, and for your positive and uplifting attitude when I call. I look forward to a time when we can all be together again to worship and have a donut together. In the meantime- what do you feel God doing in our lives and in our communities at this time? How will we be changed by this experience and how will the church be changed? God is doing a new thing in our midst. We will know God's presence and be blessed.
