IN-CHURCH WORSHIP

Well dear ones, we will be starting in person worship the week of September 14th. I am excited to be back together. In researching the Covid numbers for our area, they have been very low and we will follow all guidelines for meeting together. Here are the details:

- We will have worship on Friday morning at 11:00. We will be taping this worship and it will follow the format we have been using for television broadcast and website access. This allows us to edit and post so that the weekly worship is on Sunday morning for those who cannot come to in person worship.
- We will also have Sunday morning worship at 10:00.
- Please try to divide between the two as we will only allow 50 at a time.
- The ushers will help you socially distance and some pews may be taped off. You may sit with your family without distancing.
- We understand if you choose to not come for in person worship.
- Everyone will wear a mask. This is not negotiable. Please bring your own. We will have a limited number of masks available should you forget.
- There will be no singing or responses. (you may hum or move your body to the music)
- The worship will be shorter than pre -Covid. The longer people gather in a space the more aerosols are spread.
- There will be no coffee time and please exit the building after the worship. If you wish to visit please do so outside and socially distance.
- If at all possible try not to use the restrooms. If you must, (sometimes you just have to) please follow handwashing guidelines and disinfect surfaces.
- If you are sick, with any symptoms even if not Covid, please stay home. If you are exposed to Covid, please self- quarantine. Please let us know if you test positive and have been in the building at any time.
- Should the virus numbers increase dramatically in our area we will cancel in person worship and shut down the building.
- We will continue to keep the church doors locked during office hours but you may come in and hold meetings with the same guidelines regarding masks and distancing.
- It is difficult to cover every eventuality and this list may change.
- When the virus abates the leadership of the church will reassess and we will slowly reopen completely.

People with food needs will often stop at Bill's House, and our donations will help them as they try to meet their needs. The United Way program also works to meet community hunger through a program called Meet Up & Chow Down, an offshoot of the Buddy BackPack program. Barb Porter, Chris and Craig Johnson, Connie Rabideaux, Terry Hilar, Carol Thomas, and Ann Voss all volunteered to distribute lunches each Wednesday at Olcott Park. Lunches were served at a number of area locations every Monday through Thursday all summer long. What a wonderful community outreach! As school restarts, the BackPack program will take over. Through these volunteers and an amazing \$2,400.00 donated by a number of parishioners, we have been able to provide the gift of food, love, and caring to our community. God is working through us. Let us continue to find ways to help during the many difficulties of this pandemic and resulting job losses.

On a different subject, we are requesting you discontinue bringing items for our white elephant sale until we are able to determine if and when we will be able to have a sale. Our life will need to return to some sort of normalcy before we can make any plans, and as we all see, there is no clear idea of when that will be. Follow the safety guidelines and stay well. We will update you as we are able to make plans.
