The Methodist Church has been in the news this last month. First for the plan to divide and secondly for the Cottage Grove Church which is closing and restarting as a Church for young people. Neither story was a good representation of what is actually happening.

The plan to divide is actually a way for those who wish to divide to do it gracefully. It is only a proposal. General Conference has to happen in May and we don't know what legislation will be passed. Are there groups seeking to leave the Methodist Church? Yes. Do we know if that will happen? No. It seems that it may. The proposal allows for an exit that is not filled with anger and fighting. Who owns the building and how the obligations of financial support are issues that will come up to be negotiated should a division occur. This proposal seeks to avoid contention around these issues and was drafted by church leaders on both sides of this issue. So that all voices and perspectives were heard.

The Cottage Grove Church is an example of reporting done with little knowledge of the situation and only angry voices being represented. I do not know this church, I do not know the pastor, I don't think I know any of the previous pastors. But here are the questions I would ask: What is the history? How many pastors have attempted to lead this church into the future? Was there resistance? Sometimes churches say they want to grow and change but will resist any efforts to do so. Was this an issue of behavior or of age? And what was a risk in creating a totally new church with the same leadership in place? The scriptures tell us you cannot make new wine in old wineskins Matthew 9:17

Many of the challenges facing churches which seek to grow are resistance from the congregation. The old model of church in the decades of the sixties and seventies is not working today. The expectations of the pastor have often not changed from the way pastors used to function. I find myself walking the razor thin edge between meeting expectations and moving the church to functioning in a way that will invite and retain those who are not here.

Does that mean anyone over the age of sixty is not important? Absolutely not! I myself am over sixty and I wonder how often I don't understand how to connect with younger people. This church of all ages has been great at adapting to change. Realistically, we still have work to do to move us into the church of the future. I think we can do it together but we have to put aside old expectations and not try to create a past that doesn't work in this time and place. We cannot take for granted that what worked for us is going to work for young people today.

As we live into this new year, what can we face about ourselves that we can change? Not change for change sake but change that will invite and encourage a new generation of young believers in Christ. The task is ours and I think this church and its people are up to the task.
