A person's heart changes the disposition, whether for good or for ill.



Well, Fall finally arrived and though we know it is coming it is still a shock to our system when the temperatures cool. I think we all thought we would be done with Covid by now, only to find it is rampant in our area. It feels like another shock to our system. The news is filled with stories that make us anxious and we just want some normalcy and calm. People are angry and

behaving badly and I have a hard time understanding why. As I thought about this, I realized that we are dealing with grief. Grief for people who have died or have severe health effects from the virus, grief for the loss of relationships in our contentious political viewpoints, grief for the loss of in-person contact with family and friends, grief for how we can't do things the way we used to. The stages of grief are: denial, anger, bargaining, depression, and acceptance. Some people are in denial (the virus doesn't exist), some are in anger (no one is going to tell me to wear a mask), some are bargaining (if I stockpile goods, I will be ok), some are depressed (I am not sleeping, I can't think straight), some have reached acceptance (this is the way it is and may be for a time but I choose to live my life with joy). Grief is not linear. You do not go from denial through the stages until you reach acceptance. You may go back and forth and even skip around. Knowing this we can be compassionate and caring for those in different stages than we are. We can choose how we interact. We can choose to be kind to ourselves as we go through the stages ourselves. In all of this we know God is there to help us grieve. "How long, O God, how long "the Psalmists cried out. Max Lucado in his book; God will use this for Good, says, "You will get through this. It won't be painless. It won't be quick. But God will use this mess for good. With God's help you will get through this" So be gentle with yourselves, be gentle with each other, give yourself time to feel sad, cry if you want to, feel angry in a healthy way, and find acceptance with God's help. Then look for ways to feel joyful. Do things that make you happy, call someone and share the joy.
