I was planning what schedule we would have for Advent and Christmas this last week. Would we have in person Christmas Eve? How would we handle an overflow if many came and the Covid #'s were high? Will everyone who comes wear a mask?


And what do I do if they refuse? I knew these were the same questions I have been dealing with for almost two years. I feel stuck. Do you? I think we are in a holding pattern for the church (and in our personal lives). A holding pattern is a term that airlines use when planes are stacked up over a terminal waiting to land. The air traffic controllers will tell the waiting planes a certain altitude and a flight path to follow which keeps them safe as they circle above. Everything is in a holding pattern. Waiting for the virus to subside so we can land and get on with our lives. Trying to stay safe in a flight plan as we yearn to fly free of restrictions.

The Bible tells us of many instances where the faithful are in a holding pattern. In Exodus the freed Israelites wander for forty years before they settle in the promised land. Abraham and Sara wait 90 years for a child of their own. The disciples return to their former occupations after Jesus dies and don't move forward until Jesus invites them for lunch on the shore. God always is moving in the midst of holding patterns. It is only us humans who are impatient for them to end.

The season of Christmas is upon us. Mary waited nine months to birth the Christ Child, while the heavens and earth waited in great anticipation for the birth of a savior. We wait in great anticipation and hope for Christmas and maybe to break out of our holding pattern as we seek to follow this child into the future.

# **BOOK STUDY**

On January 5<sup>th</sup> I will be leading a book study at church. We will be meeting on Wednesday evenings at 6pm and Thursday mornings at 11am.

The book we will be reading is The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek by Kim Michele Richardson.

#### **BOOK DESCRIPTION**

In 1936, tucked deep into the woods of Troublesome Creek, KY, lives blue-skinned 19-year-old Cussy Carter, the last living female of the rare Blue People ancestry.

The lonely young Appalachian woman joins the historical Pack Horse Library Project of Kentucky and becomes a librarian, riding across slippery creek beds and up treacherous mountains on her faithful mule to deliver books and other reading material to the impoverished hill people of Eastern Kentucky. Along her dangerous route, Cussy, known to the mountain folk as Bluet, confronts those suspicious of her damselfly-blue skin and the government's new book program. She befriends hardscrabble and complex fellow Kentuckians, and is fiercely determined to bring comfort and joy, instill literacy, and give to those who have nothing, a bookly respite, a fleeting retreat to faraway lands.

#### **OVERVIEW**

The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek is a historical novel by American author Kim Michele Richardson. Published in 2019, the book takes place in the Kentucky hills during the Great Depression in 1936. In its depiction of prejudice and community in 1930s Kentucky, The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek touches upon themes including the distrust of authority, the random and dangerous nature of prejudice, the power of community, and the importance of caring.

I hope you will think about joining us. Books will be available in the church library for purchase. If you are interested please let Joan know so we can get an idea of how many books to order. The book is also available from many booksellers and for borrowing from the public library.
