Packing again. I have moved three times in 13 years. Each time I pare down my stuff a little more. But I still have too much stuff. I will be moving to a small condo with very little storage and so I

am paring down even more. I have spent the most amount of time in looking at old pictures and deciding which ones to keep and which to toss. This is difficult work. I inherited my mother's pictures and some of my in-laws. Though they are special to me, I know my children won't want them, see their value or even recognize who those people are. If I keep them, I have no place to store them. I have two large bins of fabric that I have intended to sew into artistic quilts. I haven't sewn anything for years. Will I sew in my retirement? I have many wood items I have been intending to paint. Do I bring them or is it time to let them go and start oil or watercolor painting?

This practice has me asking the questions; Who am I? Who do I want to be? What do I want to do? Very existential questions. In this time of transition, those are very important questions to ask. When I had decided to go to seminary and to become a pastor, I gave a sermon called: "What do you pack for a journey and what do you leave behind?" I think this business of packing and retiring has me asking these same questions. I am discovering how to let go of everything I own. There is grief in this process but there is also a freedom in letting go. Each item I hold brings a memory as I decide to keep it or let it go.

This process is paralleled in my leaving the church. I must leave you all behind, but not forever. I have many memories of our time together that are precious. I hope you are remembering some of our best times together. As you prepare to welcome a new pastor, what do you as a church need to pack and what will you leave behind?

If the Bible isn't a science book, instruction manual, or position paper, then what is it?
