Dear Church Family,

I've been serving churches in Northern Minnesota since 2010. Our summers are short-significantly shorter than they were when I lived in the Twin Cities. Over the years, I've learned not to schedule as many church activities during this short season where people like to spend time outdoors with family and friends. (This is true for me as well).

Churches are (finally) able to be more active following the pandemic. What does this mean for us this fall season? Michelle and I are just getting started-- so we have no experience of what Peace and Wesley were like before the pandemic. What we observed in the churches we served is a decrease in activity and people. This is true of most of the churches in our conference. Even as restrictions loosened, people have fallen away from the habit of participating in the life of the church. Life being what it is, many have also had to face more than one crisis without support from their church family.

If you've ever boarded an airplane, you may remember the instruction, "In the event of an emergency, apply your oxygen mask before assisting others." God and your church family are so much more than an oxygen mask. But the metaphor works: This is a time for healing.

Perhaps more than we've experienced in years, we have a greater need to experience God's presence while sharing in community the assurance of God's love. My hope is that we will begin the fall season by spending more time together. Peace UMC is a vital part of Virginia-- and for us to be vitally engaged with the community, we need to be vitally engaged with each other.

If we have not met, this is your invitation to meet the new pastor. Whether we have met or not, I look forward to getting to know you! My hope is that we will have more opportunities to break bread together as a community-- whether it's around the Communion table or the fellowship table.
