Did You Know... There is an American flag and a Christian flag in the sanctuary? The American flag in the sanctuary is seen by many as a way to honor both God and country.

From the historical perspective, the United States and the Methodist denomination were born at roughly the same time and grew up together: Methodist identity has been strongly linked with the nation and its ideals of democracy and liberty.

Love, honor and worship of God are primary in our Christian community and so in our worship space. We believe our first allegiance is always to Christ. The sanctuary is first and foremost a place for the worship of God.

The flag invites Christians to reflect on the relationship between faith and nation. Many see the flag as a symbol of gratitude for the freedoms enjoyed, including freedom of worship, and as an expression of prayer for the nation's leaders, citizens, and wellbeing. The flag invites us to reflect on the relationship between church and state, to recognize the church's mission within its community and nation.

The flag also invites us to reflect on the nature of Christian witness in the world. Our primary allegiance is to God's kingdom—a kingdom that welcomes believers of every nation, tribe, and tongue.

Ultimately, the presence of the American flag in the sanctuary serves as a reminder of the complex interplay between faith, gratitude, and civic identity. While it offers an opportunity for reflection on our responsibilities to both God and nation, its use is guided by the discernment and traditions of each local congregation, rather than by an official denominational stance.

Did You Know? The thirteen stripes represent the thirteen original colonies, and the fifty stars represent the fifty states. The red is for valor, white symbolizes liberty, and the blue stands for justice.
